The NDLC is a non-for-profit organisation, run by a Committee elected at the (August) Annual General Meeting. We encourage all members to attend the monthly General Meetings, as to contribute to the decision making process. Members volunteer their expertise and time, so that the Club can operate effectively and economically, allowing the Club to maintain a low fee structure. Hence we have a stable and very active membership.

Social events and field trips encourage members to interact outside their classes / workshops. The Club's Newsletter, "Lapis", keeps members informed about Club issues (please note that we need your email address to send it to you).

If you join the Club, you will acquire lapidary skills like cutting cabochons (in different styles) in our well-equipped cutting room or making silver jewellery (of all designs imaginable, using various techniques) or enamelling pieces (of astounding workmanship) in our a meeting & work room, etc. Our classes and permanent workshops will accommodate new members but a waiting list may apply for some and certain restrictions apply. Our teachers / instructors will ensure that everybody is guided and enabled to reach his or her full workmanship potential (including participating in competitions, if you so desire). Weekend workshops for enamelling, lost wax casting, beading, etc., may be organised during the year.

Some members have skills in tumbling stones, (bone) carving, wire wrapping jewellery and faceting but these items are currently not taught at the Club. Field trips will keep the lapidary interest high.

Club Information Sheet

The NDLC Constitution and the NDLC By-Laws mandate the Club's functioning, including Administrative issues, Membership Requirements and the Duties of the Committee.

This includes expectations regarding the behavior of members.

Members will abide by the stipulations of the Safety Booklet and the Teacher / Instructor.

Members must always act in a safe manner and prevent damage to the Club's equipment and machinery.

Members must not use the Club's facilities for personal profit. This means that a member cannot join the Club with business in mind or sell any items made using the Club's equipment or machinery for profit.

The sale of any items made solely in the private workshop of a member is, of course, at the member's discretion.

Members must not abuse any other member.

The NDLC is non-commercial and hence does not provide services to non-members.

We do not allow dealers / traders / private persons to sell any lapidary items to members in the Club rooms.

We do not sell any items to non-members outside Special Sales Days at the Club rooms and our Bi-annual Gem & Mineral Show / Exhibition at the Beecroft Community Centre.

We do not cut slabs / rocks for non-members on club equipment. Members may do as they please on their own equipment and premises.

We do not set facetted stones / cabochons for non-members using club premises / equipment. Private arrangements may be made by members using their own equipment and premises.

For legal reasons, we do not recommend industrial service providers or traders.

The main fundraising function of the NDLC is its Bi-annual Gem & Mineral Show / Exhibition at the Beecroft Community Centre, always on the last weekend of October.

Due to the non-commercial nature of the NDLC, it **does not** invite traders of any kind to the Exhibition.

All items sold at the Exhibition are club property, many items specially made, or donated, by club members.

Club members cannot sell their own items at the Exhibition.

All displays shown are either club members' entries to the club competition, or members' own creations showing their skills in cabochon cutting, jewellery making, enamelling, casting and related crafts or interests. None of these items can be sold.
